
Message from President Brad Senter

Chaplain's Corner

Rev. Dr. Lee Martin, '63-65'

Some years ago I and a friend were climbing up one of the high but manageable hills in West Virginia. When we reached the top of the hill we were greatly impressed by the beautiful blue haze that swept across the expanse of the hills we could see before us.

Very soon after reaching the top and getting that awesome view of the blue haze, I became aware of something else. It was the profound silence that greeted us. With the exception of a single honey bee buzzing and a soft, pleasant, almost inaudible breeze blowing through a nearby pine, it was the silence surrounding us that captured my attention.

All of the usual sounds and cadences of daily life and work seemed so far away from that moment that they quickly faded from my awareness.

The experience of encountering nature on that hill-top reminds me of a truth that is often over-looked in the busy fever of modern lives: God's first language He uses to communicate Himself to us is "silence".

If you should find yourself wound up with hypertension or run down with exhaustion, or some other troubling mood, perhaps finding a quiet place apart from the "noise" of life, will give you a chance to slow down and calm down. In that reflective space, perhaps you could allow God to gently sweep over you and give you comfort in that moment of silence.

Lest we forget... The Spirit of Saratoga - born in war and christened in victory

"I served at sea from the very beginning. As the first Saratoga, a ship-rigged, 18-gun sloop of war in the Revolution I exacted a terrible toll from the British merchant ships attempting to re-supply the enemy.

"Still I fought for my country's freedom. In the War of 1812, on the cold waters of Lake Champlain, I lived again as a 26-gun corvette. My symbol – the fighting gamecock – was created during a furious cannon battle with the larger, more heavily armed British Man-O'-War HMS Confiance. A young American sailor's pet fighting rooster was accidently set free as a cannonball ripped through my decks. The angry bird flew to the railing, crowing fiercely at the enemy ship as if defying superior firepower. Heartened by the display, we fought on to seize a critical moment in the battle, Saratoga outmaneuvered her enemy and carried the day.

"I continued to fight for freedom hunting down slave ships off the coast of Africa shortly before the Civil War. In my third life as a first-class sloop of 20 guns, I freed nearly 1000 Africans from one salver alone in 1860.

"As the 20th Century dawned, I lived my fourth life as an armored cruiser, the flagship of Asiatic Station, United States. Then in my fifth life as the aircraft carrier CV3, I waded into World War II swinging hard. My sailors fought in the Battle of the Solomon's and in the bitter fight for Iwo Jima. As part of Task Force 58, I struck at the heart of Imperial Japan in the first carrier air strike on Tokyo.

"In my later sixth life as the Super Carrier CVA/CV60, I was commissioned in 1956 as a guardian of peace. One of the last "Cold Warriors" I and my sister ships were instrumental in the 1950's and 1960's with conflicts in the Middle East and later bringing about the collapse of the Communist tyranny in eastern Europe. My fight for freedom continued in the 1970's during Vietnam flying over 800 combat missions into North Vietnam from the Tonkin Gulf and in the 1990's during Operation Desert Storm as my sailors launched over 2,000 devastating air strikes against the forces of Saddam Hussein.

"Now as I look back on my final voyage as the peacekeeper of war-torn former Yugoslavia in support of our nation, and my decommissioning, I wonder about my next lives. Where will the call to duty carry me? Will I return to sea? Perhaps in a future century my destination will be the stars!

One thing is for sure - wherever the Star-Spangled Banner waves, wherever duty takes a US Navy sailor, there you will find me – the Spirit of Saratoga."



USS SARATOGA 2019 REUNION Charleston, SC ~ October 10-14, 2019

Welcome to Charleston

Rated one of America's top five most popular cities, Charleston is America's most beautifully preserved architectural and historic treasure, with a rich 300-year history. Described as a "living museum", the city boasts beautiful homes, tree lined cobblestone streets, and many formal gardens. The USS Saratoga Reunion will provide many opportunities to experience all this historic city has to offer. Reunion tours may include an historic Charleston city tour, a harbor



cruise, the maritime museum at *Patriots Point* and a cruise to historic *Fort Sumter*, where the Civil War began. Don't miss this chance to visit the most popular tourist city in the country.

Hotel Information

The reunion is officially scheduled from Thursday, October 10 through Monday, October 14. You will be staying at the AAA Four Diamond boutique style hotel Crowne Plaza Charleston, located at 4831 Tanger Outlet Blvd., North Charleston, SC 29418. The hotel is conveniently located across from the



huge, Tanger Outlet Mall and near several restaurants. The hotel rate is \$130 plus tax per night and includes a hot breakfast buffet. For those of you who choose to arrive early or stay after the reunion ends, the same room rate will be available for three days prior and three days after, based on availability. To reserve your room please call the Crowne Plaza Charleston directly at 843-744-4422. (Mon-Fri from 9-4) When calling the hotel, please make sure you tell them

you are attending the USS Saratoga Reunion, **Group Code: SAR.** It is always best to make your reservation <u>directly with the hotel</u> and not a central hotel-chain call center. MRP has negotiated numerous amenities for you that the call centers may not be aware of. Note: only those booking under the reunion group code are eligible for amenities like free breakfast, reduced parking, internet, etc. Booking through another channel like Expedia disqualifies you from these amenities.

We anticipate a <u>sell out</u> at the Crowne Plaza so book early. We have arranged overflow rooms at the same rate at the Fairfield Inn & Suites next door. If you prefer to stay at the Fairfield call the hotel at 843-300-3100. The Fairfield also offers a more limited free breakfast.

Hotel check-in is 4:00 p.m. Please do not expect to get into your room before then. You may cancel your hotel room up to 48 hours prior to arrival without penalty. The hotel does require a deposit or credit card number to guarantee your room reservation. Please note, the hotel reservation cut-off date is **September 10**, **2019**, thereafter, reservations will be taken on a space-available basis only.

Airport Transportation & Parking

If you are flying to the reunion, the Crowne Plaza Hotel offers complimentary shuttle service from the Charleston Airport (CHS). Upon arrival at the airport, call using the free courtesy phone in the baggage claim area. For those of you driving the hotel offers plenty of free parking. Call the hotel for driving directions.
